Description for Master of Music (M.M.) with an Area of Emphasis in Composition

The Master of Music (M.M.) with an Area of Emphasis in Composition provides in-depth knowledge of musical forms and compositional idioms of the various periods of music history, and skills essential for future creative expression. Primary career opportunities for graduates of this degree program include professional work in composition or orchestration and teaching at the two- or four-year college level. The degree also prepares graduates for future study in composition at the Ph.D. or D.M.A. level.

Specializations are available in Choral, Orchestral, and Wind Conducting. Students with an emphasis in conducting are prepared to enter the professional field, pursue a higher degree, or teach at the two-or four-year college level.
