The committee approved the following proposals which have been forwarded to the Executive Committee of University Council for consideration:

Proposal for a new minor in African American Studies

Proposal to reactivate the minor in Fashion Merchandising

Proposal to offer a dual degree in Foreign Language Education (M.A.T.) and German (M.A.)

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Proposal to terminate the major in Social Studies Education (Ed.D.)
Proposal for an Academic Affairs Policy Statement No. 20, Joint Curricular Ventures
Proposal to separate Academic Affairs Policy Statement No. 17, Extended Education, into two policies:
