Minutes of the April 22, 2013, meeting were approved.

Dr. Keith Bailey from the Office of Online Learning presented general information regarding online program development and course instruction.

The committee approved the following proposals which have been forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration:

Proposal to offer the existing major in Law under the Master of Legal Studies (M.L.S.) degree

Proposal to offer a new major in Teacher Leadership (M.Ed., Online)

Proposal to offer the existing major in General Business (B.B.A.) as an online program
Proposal to deactivate the major in Recreation and Leisure Studies (M.Ed. and Ph.D.)
Proposal to change the name of the Department of Housing and Consumer Economics to Financial Planning, Housing and Consumer Economics

The committee approved a request for a new Area of Emphasis in Critical Studies in Educational Theory and Practice under the major in Educational Theory and Practice (Ph.D.).

The committee approved a request to change the name of the Area of Emphasis in Family Financial Management to Financial Planning under the major in Consumer Economics (B.S.F.C.S.).

The committee approved a request to change the name of the prefix, HACE, Housing and Consumer Economics, to FHCE, Financial Planning, Housing and Consumer Economics.

The committee approved a request to create a new prefix, JNMW, Journalism Narrative Media Writing.

The committee briefly discussed the approval process of S-suffix courses in the CAPA system and agreed that they would like to continue reviewing courses with an S-suffix.
