Academic Courses in the UGA at Oxford Program

- Potential Oxford faculty members will be provided the approved CAPA information for all courses being taught, including the Course Description, Objectives or Expected Learning Outcomes, and the Topical Outline. These faculty members must confirm that courses they teach will include the content, course objectives, and expected learning outcomes provided in the approved course materials.
- UGA Departments or Schools/Colleges may provide syllabi or texts to Oxford faculty members for recommended or required use in courses taught from their units.
- If Departments or Schools/Colleges have specific requirements for a course that an Oxford faculty member cannot meet or agree to, another Oxford faculty member may be selected or the course not offered.
- If department heads or approving faculty have specific Oxford faculty they would like to request for teaching purposes, they should contact the Program Director to communicate this information as soon as possible.
- The Oxford faculty will be SACS-credentialed with UGA Faculty Affairs and authorized to teach UGA courses. Initially, the Program Director will be listed as the Instructor of Record on the course sections for the purposes of getting the courses loaded, but will be replaced with the appropriate Oxford faculty once they are confirmed as teaching.
- All courses will be taught using the instructional format of the University of Oxford. Oxford faculty will be asked to treat UGA students as they would Oxford students, but will submit final grades according to the UGA grading scale, which will be provided to them before teaching begins.
