The University Curriculum Committee met on January 17, 2025, at 3:30 p.m. in 327 Brooks Hall.

Chair Susan Sanchez recognized the faculty substitutes in attendance and welcomed the member representing the new School of Medicine, Dr. Erica Brownfield, to the committee.

Minutes of the September 20, 2024, University Curriculum Committee meeting were approved.

The committee unanimously approved the following proposals, which were forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration:

The committee reviewed a proposal to offer an Undergraduate Certificate in Artificial Intelligence. Following discussion of the proposal, it was recommended that the certificate be renamed the *Undergraduate Certificate in Artificial Intelligence – Computing*. The proposal was then unanimously approved with the revised name and was forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration.

The committee unanimously approved a proposal to create the following Areas of Emphasis under the major in Education (Ed.S.):

The committee unanimously approved a proposal to terminate the following Areas of Emphasis under the major in Comparative Biomedical Sciences (M.S.):

- Area of Emphasis in Biomedical Sciences
- Area of Emphasis in Zoological Medicine

The committee unanimously approved a proposal to terminate the Area of Emphasis in Biological and Life Sciences Laboratory Management under the major in Comparative Biomedical Sciences (M.S., Non-Thesis).

The committee considered a proposal to revise the Entrance Requirements of the major in Computer Science (B.S.). A motion to revise the language of the proposed Entrance Requirements was made and seconded. "In their first two attempts" was revised to "within their first two attempts." "(Equivalent to a B- average) overall or higher for the highest grades across all three courses" was revised to "(equivalent to a B- average) or higher overall for the highest grades from the two attempts for each course across all three courses." The motion was approved. Following discussion of the proposal, a motion to approve the revised proposal was made and seconded. A vote was taken and the proposal was approved.
