## 1. Justification:

Department faculty have made several revisions to the Furnishings and Interiors curriculum to prepare students with the specific skills needed for portfolio review, entrance into the major, and successful completion of the major.

2. Requirement: what specific entrance requirements are proposed?

## **PROPOSED**

**Entrance Requirements:** 

Completion of 45 hours in Core AREAS I-VI including the completion of TXMI 2350, TXMI 2360 and ARST 1050 in AREA VI. This is a high demand major. After meeting the entrance requirements, students will be selected based on the following high-demand selection criteria.

High-Demand Major – Selection Criteria Submit an application and a portfolio of work from TXMI 2360 and ARST 1050. There is no guarantee of acceptance to the major.

3. Results: How will the proposed requirement solve the academic problems outlined in one?

The proposed requirements include a studio course (TXMI 2360) offered in the sophomore year. The skills taught in this course will better prepare students for portfolio review and successful completion of the major. With the development of this course the major no longer requires ARST 1060 (Color Composition) as a preparation course for the major.

- 4. Consequences of the requirements:
  - a. How will this requirement affect the major involved?

The proposed requirements will provide the students with instruction specific to the skills required for the major.

- b. What effects are anticipated on other majors within the University? None anticipated.
- c. Are there any other anticipated effects on enrollment patterns within the University?

The School of Art may experience a slight course enrollment decrease in ARST 1060 since the TMI department is proposing to no longer require this course for the Furnishings and Interiors major.
