Instructional Technology Graduate Degree Name Change

Request

This is a request to change the name of the major offered by the Instructional Technology program from its current "Instructional Technology" to "Learning, Design, and Technology." The Instructional Technology faculty voted unanimously in favor of this change.

Justification

This requested name change for our major is a more appropriate descriptor for our program's curriculum areas than the current designation for several reasons. First, our field has changed dramatically over the past 25 years, particularly with regard to the role of instruction within a learning environment. Our faculty felt the time had come to remove "instruction" from our name because instruction is now considered as but one route to learning. These changes reflect the advances in cognitive psychology, relevant design areas (e.g. interaction design, human interface design, instructional design), philosophical assumptions about learning and education, and, of course, the remarkable advances in digital technologies.

Second, this requested name change better reflects the faculty's current scholarly activities and curriculum practices within our program than does the current name. All of our degree areas (M.Ed., Ed.S., and Ph.D.) first and foremost promote and enhance learning. This is done largely through design activities in combination with the affordances of technology. Instruction is not antithetical to any of this, but rather is subsumed in this greater mission.

Third, this name change reflects accurately our program's mission:

We are committed to discovering ideas, innovations, and technologies to shape the future of education. We prepare scholars and reflective practitioners who explore learning research and theory in practice, and advance learning theory through design and technology in formal and informal environments.

Finally, it is important to note there is no agreed upon name for our field. Examples of program names at peer or aspirant institutions include the following: Instructional Systems (Penn State); Instructional Design & Technology (Virginia Tech); Learning Systems (Florida State); Instructional Systems Technology (Indiana Univ.); Learning Sciences (Northwestern University, Stanford). As one of the leading academic programs in the world, our faculty believe that "Learning, Design, and Technology" is the most apt and succinct description of current and future directions of our field.

This change is sought for implementation as soon as possible.
