8. Abstract of the deactivated or terminated program. The College of Veterinary Medicine instituted a College-wide M.S. program in Veterinary and Biomedical Sciences. Specifically, the College-wide program permits students to pursue a degree in any of many veterinary medical focus areas, including veterinary anatomy. There are no students currently enrolled in the M.S. Anatomy program; the last student enrolled in this degree program completed his degree in 2003. Faculty will not be negatively impacted by termination of the M.S. Anatomy program because they will be able to offer the same graduate training under the M.S. in Veterinary and Biomedical Sciences program. The graduate program of the College and University will not be negatively or otherwise impacted by termination of the M.S. Anatomy degree, for the above reasons. Reinstatement of this program is not planned.
