Dear Hugh:

The Graduate Faculty of the Department of Romance Languages met on 9 March 2007 to discuss termination of the MAT degrees in French and Spanish offered by this Department. The main rationale for termination was that we have been unable to attract students to this degree due to the fact that the Department cannot provide teaching certification. The Graduate Faculty voted in favor of termination by a vote of 15 Yes, 0 No, 2 Abstain.

At the time of the vote, 1 student was enrolled in the MAT in French. This student will be switching to the MA in French. No students have been adversely affected by the departmental decision to terminate. The faculty in Romance Languages have a strong commitment to our MA and PhD programs in French, Italian, Portuguese, Romance Languages and Spanish. For these programs we have a total of 65 new or returning graduate students for AY07-08, and it is here that we wish to concentrate our efforts at the graduate level.
