Area of Emphasis Description:

The Area of Emphasis in Spanish Interdisciplinary Studies under the major in Spanish (A.B.) offers students the opportunity to integrate their Spanish proficiency in language, culture, linguistics, and/or literature with other areas of interest, or another major, by combining Spanish courses and related courses focused on international, cultural, or linguistic matters. The Area of Emphasis in Spanish Interdisciplinary Studies requires 30 credit hours.

Area of Emphasis Requirements:

Note: Spanish requires individual review of non-equivalent transfer courses before they can be used to satisfy Major Requirements.
