The department requests this change to remove duplicated information in the program name. Specifically, part of the Area of Emphasis name is included in the degree names, Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) in Special Education and Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Special Education. For the Area of Emphasis that falls under the M.A.T. and M.Ed. degrees in Special Education, the name should be "Adapted Curriculum and Autism." This naming is consistent with the Georgia Professional Standards Commission's certification area. The addition of "and Autism" reflects a particular disability which is a focus of the faculty in this preparation program and a primary category of disability that teachers support with this credential.
