UGA update to attendance policy April 2022

When students are absent due to University-sponsored activities approved by the Vice President for Instruction, the Vice President for Student Affairs, the Provost, or their designee, the student should not be penalized for this absence.

If the absence results in a student being unable to complete an evaluative event that contributes to the final grade, the instructor is expected to provide the student the opportunity to complete all missed evaluative events in a timely manner as agreed to by the instructor and the student.

In the case of a test, the professor can decide if the student should take the test before leaving on the trip, while on the trip (at the same time as the rest of the class), proctored by university personnel or their designee, or after the trip.

Instructors should receive written notice during the first week of semester from the faculty member or university official sponsoring the activity. If an activity is scheduled after this time, the instructor should receive written notice at least two weeks in advance from the faculty member or university official sponsoring the activity. It is the student's responsibility to make sure this written notice has occurred. In the rare instance that a student's absences will affect the majority of class meetings, the student should work with their advisor during drop/add to find a different class or section.
