New Prefix Requested: MEDI, Medicine

**Justification:** The Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree with a major in Medicine was approved by the Board of Regents in November 2024. The degree is offered by the School of Medicine. A new prefix, MEDI, is being requested as part of establishing the M.D. degree program. This prefix will apply to all M.D. degree courses. A single, unified course prefix establishes a clear identity for the medical school as it differentiates M.D. coursework from other health-related programs, provides administrative clarity, and facilitates course management. Furthermore, the M.D. curriculum is a longitudinal, integrated curriculum that spans over a four-year period. A unified prefix reinforces the structured and sequential nature of the M.D. program.
