The M.A.T. degree is for students who wish to pursue GA teacher certificate in P-12 World Language or P-12 TESOL. The M.A.T. program has a minimum of 36 semester hours of coursework, two prerequisites (an EDSE course and a language-specific course), an end-of-program portfolio, and a departmental graduate conference poster presentation.
