To Whom It May Concern

In response to the Basis Information Item 8 of the instruction regarding termination of a graduate program at the University of Georgia, I am writing this letter of explanation. The Seven Year Program Review of the Center for the Study of Global Issues (Globis) was concluded on July 29th, 2010. The Review Committee had recommended the termination of the Certificate program for two reasons: (1) There has been a shortage of student enrollment in the program; (2) The newly created Master in International Policies (MIP) within the School of Public and International Affairs (SPIA) which is designed to achieve generally the same objectives as a practical degree. Given the above, the continuation of the Certificate Program at the graduate level deemed unnecessary. I agreed with the Review Committee's recommendation for termination of the program.
