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The committee approved requests to add the following courses to the University Core Curriculum; these requests will be forwarded to the Council on General Education for consideration:

The committee approved a request from the School of Public and International Affairs for school-wide requirements for undergraduate degrees in the school. The committee also approved revised entrance requirements for the major in Political Science under the Bachelor of Arts degree.

The committee discussed a request to revise entrance requirements and high-demand status for the undergraduate majors in the Grady College of Journalism and Mass Communication. The committee voted to approve the request pending revision by the College.

The committee approved a request to add a second title for selected courses such as special topics and seminar courses. This request will be forwarded to Dr. James Fletcher, Associate Vice President for Instruction.

The committee considered and approved changes to UNIV courses that will be used in the placement of students.

The committee approved a request from the graduate school for changes in 7005 and 9005 courses.

The committee considered a proposal to cancel the Environmental Literacy Requirement. The committee decided the proposal should be considered by the internal review team established by Dr. Mace to review the Environmental Literacy Requirement.

The committee considered a proposal to eliminate the physical education requirement. After much discussion, the committee voted 9 to 3 not to support the proposal.

The committee re-elected Dr. William Vencill as chair of the University Curriculum Committee for the 2003-2004 year.
