We propose to form a new Department of Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology (EPIT) effective July 1, 2004. Our Department will be comprised of two units, Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology. Specific Program areas for the new department will be determined by July 1, 2004 based on discussions among the current program area faculty, and any new faculty who wish to join the EPIT Department. The current program areas are:

Technology Integration

Applied Cognition and Development

Instructional Psychology, Training and Technology

We share numerous overlapping interests and characteristics that serve as the rationale for our merger. Among other factors the Instructional Technology and Educational Psychology Departments:

- > Have numerous faculty that hold degrees from departments of Educational Psychology,
- > Both departments emphasize graduate and doctoral education,
- > A required service course for undergraduate teacher education majors, staffed by teaching assistants, is offered by each of our units,
- > Faculty from both departments already collaborate on research projects in the Learning Performance and Support Laboratory, and
- > Applied Cognition and Development, and Instructional Technology faculty share interests in the study of cognition.

We think that these similarities will strengthen over time and coalesce in the form of new research, instructional, service and outreach collaborations.
