The University Curriculum Committee met on October 17, 2014, at 3:00 p.m. in room 315 New College.

Dr. Sarah Covert of the Environmental Literacy Subcommittee presented a draft of the proposed changes to the Environmental Literacy Requirement and name change to Environmental Awareness Requirement. The committee decided that the proposed changes would be an information item for this meeting and the proposal would be considered as an action item for the January 16, 2015, meeting. The committee requested that data regarding available seats in courses which meet criterion 2 of the current requirement, the consequences of human activity on local, regional, and global natural systems, be included when the proposal is submitted for consideration.

After much discussion, the committee tabled a request from the Cultural Diversity Subcommittee to revise the Academic Affairs Policy Statement No. 11, Procedures for Establishing or Changing Implementation Plans for the Cultural Diversity Requirement. The committee requested that wording regarding study abroad and extracurricular experiences be revised and not removed from the policy.
