Upper Division General Electives (12 hours)

Twelve hours are required (four courses) and each course must be three hours each.

Choose from 4000-5000 level Terry College prefix courses outside the Economics major: ACCT, ENTR, FINA, ILAD, INTB, LEGL, MARK, MBUS, MGMT, MIST, MSIT, REAL, or RMIN (also includes MBUS prefix 3000 level). Exceptions: ECON 4800 may satisfy 3 hours of this requirement, and a

maximum of two courses (6 hours) of ECON prefix courses (3000-5000 level) may be used with permission of the major advisor. Note: A minimum of 3 hours must be satisfied with a Terry College prefix course in residence at UGA.
