Dear Committee:

Attached is a proposal to establish an "Area of Emphasis" for Health & Physical Education majors. Our program faculty has determined that we have an emerging type of student that wants to teach sport and physical activity but not in public schools. Therefore, these students are best served by taking coursework and having other educational experiences different from than the required *KINS 5460 – Student Teaching in Physical Education* which is required for anyone seeking to be a school teacher.

Previously, we have given students the option of pursuing a "non-certification track" but now need it to be officially declared an "Area of Emphasis." Further necessitating this action is the new policy of the *Georgia Professional Standards Commission (PSC)* requiring Teacher Preparation Programs to collect/report key assessment data on all students in the program. These data are intended to reflect only those students who are truly preparing to be school teachers.

Currently, "non-certification track" students not clearly marked as having an "Area of Emphasis" are included in the program and COE data collection and can render the data invalid. The ramifications of having invalid data are, as you know, severe for Teacher Preparation Programs and Colleges of Education in Georgia. Having non-certification track students not classified as Teacher Candidates (TCs) makes it easier for our program and the COE to provide data that are accurate and representative of our TCs and our program.

As Program Coordinator, I respectfully request that you approve this proposal.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

A baccalaureate degree program must require at least 21 semester hours of upper division courses in the major field and at least 39 semester hours of upper division work overall.

Required Courses (70 hours)

(A minimum grade of "C" (2.0) or higher is required.)

Students are required to demonstrate eight sport competencies. This may be achieved via completion of <u>PEDB</u> classes or credit for high school varsity participation in interscholastic competition. Three of the competencies are designated by the state: swimming, outdoor recreation (i.e., GORP), and dance (i.e., <u>DANC 3070</u>: Children's Dance for Teachers). The remaining five competencies are selected by the student. Students will not receive credit for <u>PEDB</u> classes which are noted as high school competencies (e.g., played varsity basketball, cannot receive credit for <u>PEDB 1040</u>: Beginning Basketball).
