The General Education Subcommittee of the University Curriculum Committee met on October 14, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. via Zoom.

The subcommittee unanimously approved the minutes of the September 2, 2021, General Education Subcommittee meeting.

The subcommittee discussed the proposal for Institutional Competencies. The proposal recommends that courses, non-credit activities, and co-curricular experiences be mapped to one or more of the following proposed six institutional competencies:

- 1) Critical Thinking
- 2) Communication
- 3) Moral Reasoning (Ethics)
- 4) Global/Intercultural Fluency
- 5) Creativity & Innovation
- 6) Collaboration

Following discussion, Harold Briggs motioned to approved to the proposal for Institutional Competencies. David Spooner seconded the motion. The subcommittee unanimously approved the proposal for Institutional Competencies.

William Vencill provided an update on the Board of Regents' timeline for implementing a new University System of Georgia General Education Curriculum. It was recommended that the University of Georgia should proceed with moving forward on its proposed revised General Education Curriculum.

An extended meeting of the General Education Subcommittee to discuss UGA's proposal for a revised General Education Curriculum is scheduled for December 10, 2021.
