Undergraduate Certificates are now in DegreeWorks and are displayed as separate audits.


Students prior to Fall 2025 will receive a message stating that DegreeWorks requirements are unavailable for their Bulletin Year.



Certificate Prior to Fall 2025




New Undergraduate:


Updates to the Undergraduate Audits

BBA Programs



A course attribute is a designation that helps categorize a course for a specific purpose. For example, a course attribute may indicate whether a course fulfills a particular program or graduation requirements. It may highlight specific course characteristics such as format or the inclusion of special components (e.g., lab, writing intensive).

Course attributes also assist both students and advisors with identifying courses that meet certain academic requirements. Users can click on the attribute Course Link to view applicable courses.

All individual course options were listed as separate course links under still needed courses.




New:

The attribute link option allows students to choose from any course with said attribute. Click on the attribute link, and a popup will display listing all applicable course options, meeting times, and real-time seat availability.




Attribute link popup:



When students register for classes in Athena, they will see the corresponding attribute listed on applicable courses.






Cross-Listing

Entrance Requirements

Entrance requirement blocks display courses that are required before a student can apply to be admitted to certain majors. This block will also remain in the audit for certain programs after students are accepted into their major and are no longer an intended major.

Old: The Entrance Requirements block was previously text-only and no longer displayed after a student was admitted into an official program.

As a student in an intended major, please note the following entrance requirements: Students must meet the following application eligibility requirements to be considered eligible to apply. Meeting these minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the BBA Finance major. A) Eligible for current enrollment at UGA Applicants must be eligible for enrollment at the University of Georgia in the semester in which they apply to a Terry major. B) Minimum GPAs Applicants must be in 'good academic standing' at UGA, meaning they must have a 2.0 or higher UGA GPA, or no UGA GPA for a new transfer student. Applicants must also have a 2.6 or higher earned overall GPA (transfer and UGA coursework combined). C) MATH 1113 Applicants must have successfully completed or have earned an exemption for MATH 1113 or MATH 1113E or higher-level MATH course. A passing grade or exemption must be posted to your UGA academic record by the application deadline. D) ACCT 2101 Applicants must have successfully completed ACCT 2101 or ACCT 2101E or ACCT 2101H. A passing grade or exemption must be posted to your UGA academic record by the application deadline. E) BUSN 3000 (formerly MSIT 3000) Applicants must have successfully completed or be currently enrolled in BUSN 3000 or BUSN 3000E or BUSN 3000H during the semester in which they are applying to their first Terry major. F) Other Curriculum Requirements Applicants need to have completed or be in the process of completing the BBA General Education Core Curriculum Areas I-VI, OR Applicants need to have completed or be in the process of completing the BBA General Education Core Curriculum Area VI and have a minimum of 58 credit

New: Course options are displayed if applicable. This block remains in the audit after students are accepted into an official program and are no longer an intended major.





Note: Only required courses are displayed. If the requirement states that a list of courses can be considered, they will not be displayed.

Courses Displayed

MATH 1113

Applicants must have successfully completed or have earned an exemption for MATH 1113 or MATH 1113E or higher-level MATH course. A passing grade or exemption must be posted to your UGA academic record by the application deadline.

ACCT 2101

Applicants must have successfully completed <u>ACCT 2101</u> or <u>ACCT 2101E</u> or <u>ACCT 2101H</u>. A passing grade or exemption must be posted to your UGA academic record by the application deadline.

BUSN 3000 (formerly MSIT 3000)

Applicants must have successfully completed or be currently enrolled in <u>BUSN 3000</u> or <u>BUSN 3000E</u> or <u>BUSN 3000E</u> or <u>BUSN 3000H</u> during the semester in which they are applying to their first Terry major.

Courses Not Displayed

Grades in prefix courses -- Grades in courses previously completed in the prefix of the major to which the applicant is applying can be considered, but are not required, for admission to the major. Grades in the College's Foundation First courses (<u>FINA 3000</u>, <u>MARK 3000</u>, <u>MGMT 3000</u>), as well as <u>BUSN 3000</u>, can be considered for all majors if completed. Consideration of the Foundation First courses mainly applies to students seeking to change or add Terry majors. It is beneficial to take these Foundation First courses at UGA.

Honors

The Honors block will not factor into audit completion.

Once a student has completed all other DegreeWorks requirements, the Degree block displays COMPLETE even if the Honors block displays INCOMPLETE.


Honors Students: Courses that apply ONLY to the Honors requirement block are considered general electives.




Honors students may also see a change to the functionality of the General Elective Credits Required in the Degree block. Previously, the Honors block was required for audit percent completion. Courses that ONLY applied to the Honors block would reduce the credits needed for General Elective Credits Required.

The Honors block is no longer required for percent completion. Courses that ONLY apply to the Honors requirement block are considered general electives. The General Elective Credits Required number will remain the same even if a general elective course falls there.

Previous behavior: General Elective Credits Required = 20. A course for 3 credits meets the Honors requirement and does not share with another audit requirement. The General Elective Credits Required would be reduced to 17.


New behavior: General Elective Credits Required = 20. A course for 3 credits meets the Honors requirement and does not share with another audit requirement. The General Elective Credits Required will remain 20 because the Honors block is considered a general electives block.



Overall Credit

This value includes all in-progress and completed coursework applied to the audit as well as credits in Excess Credits.

A minimum of 120 credits are required for this degree. You have 117 (including In-Progress/Pre-Registered). Some of the credits you have may not satisfy specific requirements for your degree and additional hours may be required.

Physical Education Requirement

The Credits Required in Degree blocks now have an additional hour to accommodate the Physical Education requirement.


One hour of PEDB falls in the **University Requirements** block rather than the **Quarter System Credit and Credit Not Counted Towards Graduation section.**







What-If


The What-If now auto-populates the College when the Degree is chosen. If only one program is tied to the degree, it will also auto-populate the Program and Major.




Grade Changes


NG and I Grades

Old: Courses with NG (Not Graded) and I (Incomplete) grades fell into the requirement blocks. When students received NG or I-grades in the past, the courses met requirements or General Electives.





New: NG and I grades now fall into *Quarter System Credit and Credit Not Counted Towards Graduation*. The decision was made to let the auditor move these courses to the *Quarter System Credit and Credit Not Counted Towards Graduation*. This allows graded courses to fulfill the requirements if applicable for graduation clearance purposes.



Note: Once the courses receive a grade (if applicable), they will move to meet a requirement if needed.
