## **Resolution 38-26**

### **A Resolution Regarding an Academic Progress Snapshot**

Authored by: Senator Joe Eustace, Franklin College of Arts and Sciences; Senator Lily Kreindler, At-Large

Sponsored by: Senator Amanda Neighbour; Franklin College of Arts and Sciences

*Abstract: The resolution revises [Resolution 38-16 Midterm Grade Submission Expectation](#) to address concerns raised in the University Curriculum Committee of University Council.*

WHEREAS, timely insight into academic performance allows students to adjust their approaches and engage with course material at higher levels; and,

WHEREAS, an earlier version of this resolution (Resolution 38-16: Midterm Grade Submission Expectation) was unanimously endorsed by the Educational Affairs Committee of University Council; and,

WHEREAS, academic disciplines have different pedagogical approaches to course design and graded material; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the 38th Senate of the Student Government Association, on behalf of the student body, recommends that the University of Georgia establish an Academic Progress Snapshot for all courses by grading assignments submitted by the midpoint of an academic term in a timely manner; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the 38th Senate recommends individual academic units develop appropriate policies to enact an Academic Progress Snapshot consistent with their unique circumstances and central policies; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution be presented to the University Council for consideration and an Academic Progress Snapshot be in effect starting in the Spring 2027 term.
