The Educational Affairs Committee met on October 22, 2018, at 3:30 p.m.

Minutes of the September 24, 2018, meeting were approved.

Mark Farmer reported that since the last meeting of the Educational Affairs Committee, the Petitions Subcommittee has reviewed 25 student appeals. Of those appeals, 20 were approved and 5 were denied.

Mark Farmer updated the status of the proposals to revise Policy 4.02-3, University Policy on Course Drops and Withdrawals, and Policy 4.03-1, Presidential Scholar and Dean's List, which were submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration. As there has not been a meeting of the Executive Committee since the last Educational Affairs Committee meeting, the proposals have not yet been considered by the Executive Committee.

The Office of Academic Honesty provided the 2017-2018 Academic Affairs Honesty Annual Report, which will be forwarded to the University Council for information only. The committee

discussed the possibility of researching software that would help detect plagiarism and asked for information regarding products used by peer and aspirational institutions.

The Registrar's Office provided a draft of the 2020-2021 Academic Calendar for the committee to review. The committee members will obtain feedback from the schools/colleges they represent.

Mark Farmer updated the committee on the block scheduling proposal that was discussed earlier in the year. He will continue to work with the Office of Institutional Research and the Student Government Association to get more data and feedback about the proposal.

The next meeting of the Educational Affairs Committee is scheduled for November 12, 2018.
