The Educational Affairs Committee met on August 18, 2014, at 3:35 p.m.

Minutes of the April 28, 2014, meeting were approved.

Dr. Mauricio summarized the responsibilities of the committee and the subcommittee for new members. He stated that the committee made a recommendation last year regarding a change to the academic calendar, and he would like to see the committee revisit the different options available for scheduling the academic calendar.

The 2014-2015 Petitions Subcommittee signup sheet was distributed, and members were asked to sign up for three time slots. A copy of the signup sheet will also be distributed to the committee via email to allow members to volunteer after reviewing their schedules.

Dr. Mauricio updated the committee on the results of the four Petition Subcommittee meetings held since the last Educational Affairs Committee meeting. On May 19, 2014, 24 appeals were reviewed, 16 were approved,

and 8 were denied. On June 16, 2014, 36 appeals were reviewed, 28 were approved, and 8 were denied. On July 15, 2014, 30 appeals were reviewed, 18 were approved, and 12 were denied. On August 18, 2014, 26 appeals were reviewed, 14 were approved, and 12 were denied.
